Extra challenge: Can you find the **thickest object** that a magnet can still work through?

Create your own dance! Choose a piece of music you enjoy and create **5 different dance moves.**

Try to include:

- A **travelling move** – move from one place to another
- A **turn**
- A **balance or freeze**
- A **jump**
- A move using a different **level** – high, medium or low
